

Report on Educational Activities of Hospice Nepal

Executive Summary

As the lack of awareness and knowledge about palliative care among both the health care workers and the public ate large has been recognized as a major hurdle in improving the care of patients suffering from life threatening illness, Hospice Nepal has taken educational activities as a priority. Apart from giving services to the patients who come to Hospice, it had been conducting educational activities. These were of mainly two kinds; one was a two day course for doctors, nurses and other health care workers and the second was a half day workshop for lay public.

With the funding received from ANMF for this purpose, this has eased the pressure to find the resources to conduct these activities. It has also helped us to go outside Kathmandu as well as to sponsor participants from outside the valley. The participation has been very encouraging, with participants very eager to come from the remote areas as well. In a course conducted in Pokhra, there were participants from as far as from Nepalgunj.

The details of the activities are shown in detail.

- 1. The number of participants were lower than usual due to Tansen being a small place; however, the number could have been increased if the organizer had advertised in nearby places like Butuwal or Bhairhawa.
- 2. The participants were very enthusiastic
- 3. The pre-test marks were lower than usual because of several of the participants were of non-medical background.
- 4. There was improvement in the post test; however, the average mark remained lower .
- 5. It was the first time we had social worker, Chaplain etc in the course. They managed quite well and interacted very well during the course.
- 6. Most of the teaching was done in Nepali inspite of the slides being in English.
- 7. Almost all changed their view of good death.
